AP Research Literature Review Checklist

State the topic of your inquirythe broad phenomenon you began with (For example: lung disease, water conservation, etc.)
State the narrow focus of your inquiry (For example: potential treatment of pulmonary alveolar proteinosis, environmental impact of replacing storm drains with water trapping cisterns in the San Fernando Valley.)
Provide a short, but detailed history of the relevant aspects of your topic
Define key terms, concepts, and theories relevant to your topic
Provide a review of existing sources that have led to your narrow focus
Review the foundational texts on your topic. * Review, for our purposes, means: Summarize the arguments, evaluate the lines of reasoning and evidence, and evaluate the main responses to these texts.
Review the sources that have carried on the work of these foundational sources, or have contributed to the existing body of knowledge on your topic.
Review sources that challenge or qualify these foundational texts
Identify main arguments, disagreements, or differences of perspective on the topic
Evaluate and synthesize a response, where necessary, to these arguments
(For example: While there is much disagreement about Los Angeles' county legal rights to water from the Owens Valley, if such an arrangement were to be made today surely most courts would rule against it. Regardless, the most pressing issue is not to lay blame over the way water is conserved or misused in Southern California, but to figure out more viable means of reforming our water infrastructure.)
Explain how your evaluation of the multiple perspectives on your broad topic has led to your narrow focus
Justify the inclusion/citation of the sources you used to create your understanding of the topic.
Identify gaps in the existing body of knowledge about your narrow focus
Identify a specific purpose for your research: to explore something, explain something, or create something
Explain how accomplishing this purpose will help address one of the these gaps
Offer a justified, convincing rationale for your inquiry and its related purpose. How will addressing the gap in this way benefit our understanding of the topic, discipline, scholarly field or real world?
Propose a hypothesis about what you expect will happen as a result of your research
