SLIDE SET#1 - <u>Wordle for Inquiry Proposal Form</u> (IPF) - (Note key terms that jump out of Wordle Image)

SLIDE SET #2A1&2,B1&2,C1&2... - <u>Wordle Slides</u> for each foundational source, interspersed with a slide that communicates the following information (<u>one additional slide for each foundational source</u>).

- **♦** Picture of Author
- Major career highlight
- ♦ Name of article (date)
- ♦ Most significant influence on academic literature reviewed and/or design of methods (think: similarities are good). How & Why??

SLIDE SET #3A,B,C... - <u>State Your Research Question</u> - First slide is the research question alone. Add no more than three slides to close your presentation with the following information.

- ♦ Verbally describe the scope of your research?
- ♦ How will your research questions and methods be the same as the foundational sources?
- ♦ How is your research question and methods be different from your foundational sources use the "gap" word in your presentation.
- ♦ Significance to general public?
- **♦** Significance to other researchers?

SLIDE SET#4 - Finish With IPF Wordle Slide

- "What do you find most interesting about your research so far?"
- ♦ Entice your audience into needing to see your finished product.
